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CURRICULUM VITAE

With a scientific training (he studied Neurobiology at the University of Sussex, England), and after a period of teaching and study in various countries (Iran, Pakistan, India, Italy), Christopher Huw Evans (Guildford, UK, 1951) is now based in Italy, where he has worked as a translator and writer for over forty years.

In addition to a series of collaborations with newspapers and magazines in Great Britain, the United States and Italy (his articles and photographs have been published by *Airone*, *Weekend*, *Capital*, *Scienze Digest*, and *Il Giorno* in Italy), he has translated some five hundred books over this period, from Italian and French, for such publishing houses as Thames & Hudson, Löcker Verlag, MIT Press, Electa, Mondadori, Rizzoli, Idea Books, Monacelli Press, Skira, Mazzotta, Bompiani, Marsilio, Mousse and Scala.

The majority of these books have been on the subjects of art, architecture, design and history, and they include the catalogues of the Venice Biennale and Venice Film Festival, the Milan Triennale, several Expos and many other major exhibitions. In addition he has done translation work for institutions and companies like the Council of Europe, the Bank of Italy, Monte dei Paschi di Siena, 3M, the Banca Nazionale di Lavoro, IBM, Giorgio Armani and the Milan Trade Fair.

He specializes in texts on art and architecture, in particular that of the Renaissance period, including translations of writings by Leonardo, Michelangelo and Bramante, and on contemporary art, collaborating on a regular basis with a number of curators, including Germano Celant, Rita Selvaggio, Eva Fabbris and Milovan Farronato.

He has also translated a series of CD-ROMs on art and history for SCALA of Florence and EMME of Paris, and Leonardo da Vinci's *Hammer Codex* for Microsoft/IBM.
